- **2004:** Pre-APNIC 18 Workshop, August 2004, Nadi, Fiji
- **2005:** First PacNOG Meeting in June
 - Nadi, Fiji
 - 1 workshop over 1 week
 - **Topics:** FreeBSD, Mail and Web, Security, Routing (BGP and Multihoming)
 - Hosted by The Pacific Islands Telecommunications Association (PITA)
 - 30 participants from around the Pacific
