A forum has been formed at APNIC to discuss public policy issues to foster sustainability, security, stability and development of the Internet, Facilitate exchange of information and best practices as well as strengthen and enhance the engagement of stakeholders in existing and/or future Internet policy developments.

PPAC is a multi-stakeholder forum which provides an opportunity for the broader regional community to meet, discuss and share ideas. It's a platform for dialogue and not binding decisions, using the conventions of the Internet Governance Forum (IGF) framework.

Aims to represent views of all stakeholders in the internet space including government, industry, civil society and technical/academic community have been involved - to help steer focused and enlightened dialogue on issues relating to the growth of internet in the region, policies to guide internet development, and share best practices - through an open consultative platform for engagement.

# PPAC Update from 1<sup>st</sup> Session

## (APNIC 35, Singapore)

- PPAC session will be to be held at every APNIC Meeting, APNIC Conference and APRICOT for the coming 3 years.
- Emphasis to be on transforming Internet to Equinet.
- There is a need to have a outreach programme for a wider engagement of Government as a stakeholder in the deliberation of PPAC. The required level of protocol as applicable will need to be maintained.
- Decision on forming a small subcommittee who can help work on the draft rules for a structure, functioning, agenda, periodicity at PPAC. The sub-committee to comprise of the following members:

# Summary of Discussions

The draft covers the following key aspects:

*To encourage exchange of information and dialog between APNIC and Internet / ICT Public Policy developers within the Asia-Pacific Region.*

- **Objective:**

*The PPAC will foster an increased level of sharing of information and perspectives between APNIC and Internet/ICT Public Policy stakeholders with a view to advancing APNIC objectives.*

- **Purpose**

- **Structure / Periodicity**

- **Agenda**

- **Public Policy Principles** (*Open Internet, Competitiveness, Multi-stakeholderism, Policies to Align with Internet, Accessibility, Policies to match the pace of Technology, Protection of Internet*)

- Draft to remain before the community members for 2 weeks for additional comments before being submitted to EC for approval and incorporation.
