### Introduction

For the past decade, the Internet Society has been active in following the discussions on [Internet governance](#), having participated in both phases of the World Summit on Information Society (WSIS) – in Geneva (2003) and Tunis (2005) – and has supported the Internet Governance Forum (IGF), which emerged from the WSIS process.

- gather information on the different practices and understandings of multistakeholder governance
- survey data will be used in publications on the evolution of multistakeholder participation
- ISOC will incorporate survey feedback into its preparations for upcoming Internet governance discussions (IGF, WTDC, WSIS+10)
