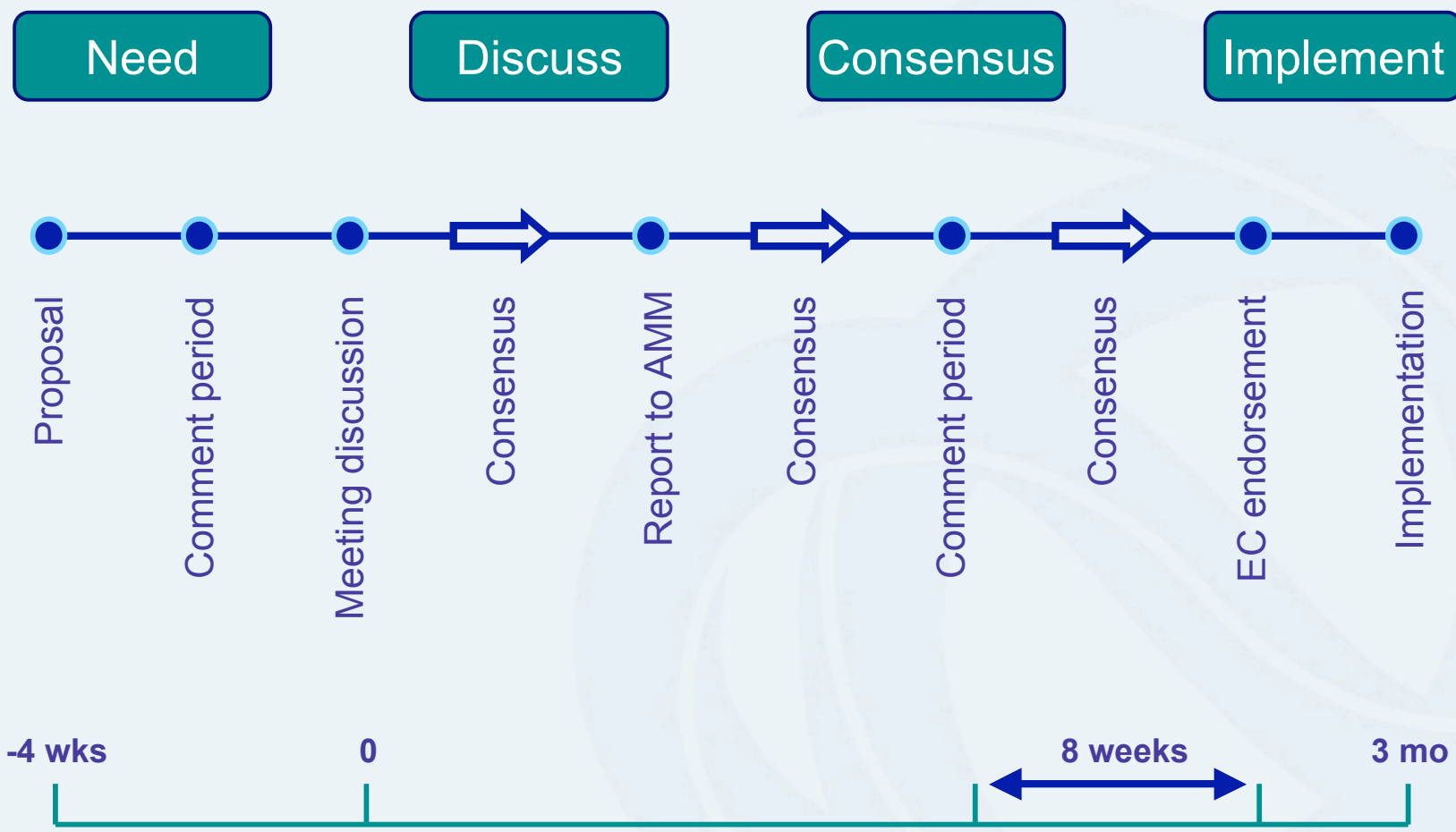
- Charter
