
# AfriNIC at a glance today


- ▶ 2009 Budget:
  - Operating cost: ~ USD 1.8 M
- Head count: 15 staff (1 part time)
  - Business Area: 4
  - Communications Area: 3
  - Technical Area: 7
  - A new Technical Operation Area Manager hired and joining 1<sup>st</sup> August
  - 3 additional full time staff to be hired by end of 2009.

Membership: 560 Members at the end of June 2009




#### Some Core activities Stats












- WAIGF: AfriNIC is leading efforts to organise a regional IGF event in West Africa.
- Infrastructure redundancy Plan
- Review of online training tools (material, CBT, virtual Lab ... etc).
- Root Servers Anycast Copy Program:
  - First Node installed in Tanzania two weeks ago
  - Two requests in the pipe.
- AfriNIC Routing Registry
- Reviewing and exploring a full automation of new membership process.



## Office Relocation Project

- One of our major side project this year is the relocation to new office.
  - Turned Key approach: Call for proposal for design and fit out (completed - 7765 sq.ft)
    - Plan to move by end of 2009






#### Cooperation
