ARIN

- Introduced 23 March 2009 (ARIN-2009-3)
- Adopted 13 January 2010
 - This version does not include mandatory return of address space to IANA





ASO AC

- Status: This global proposal is "abandoned;" it cannot advance in its current state because the same version was not adopted at all five RIRs.
