- **pol-34-01**
 - Pending approval at each remaining stage of the policy proposal process, APNIC Secretariat to implement proposal prop-104: **Clarifying demonstrated needs requirement in IPv4 transfer policy.**
 - **Status:** Implemented on 18 February 2013.
- **pol-34-02**
 - Pending approval at each remaining stage of the policy proposal process, APNIC Secretariat to implement proposal prop-101: **Removing multihoming requirement for IPv6 portable assignments.**
 - **Status:** Implemented on 18 February 2013.
- **pol-31-05**
 - Pending approval at each remaining stage of the policy proposal process, APNIC Secretariat to implement proposal prop-097: **Global policy for post exhaustion IPv4 allocation mechanisms by the IANA.**
 - **Status:** Implemented at APNIC. Pending implementation by IANA.

Policy SIG Charter

- Develop policies and procedures which relate to the management and use of Internet address resources by APNIC, NIRs and ISPs within the Asia Pacific region
- Mailing lists
 - sig-policy@apnic.net
 - sig-policy-chair@apnic.net

Steps to Implementation

- Proposal submission
- Mailing list discussion before meeting
- Consensus at Policy SIG Meeting
- Consensus at the AMM
- Comment Period to confirm consensus
- EC endorsement
- Editorial Comment period
- Implementation

Consensus Decision Making

- Consensus = “general agreement” taking into consideration comments on the mailing list and at the meeting.
- Show of hands is a way of “broadly gauging opinion”
- Comments via Remote Participation are welcome
- Example definitions from Tao of IETF:
 - a very large majority of those who care must agree
 - strongly held objections must be debated until most people are satisfied that these objections are wrong

Remember

- Minor Objections
 - some problems may occur for some members of the group
- Major Objections
 - major problems will occur for parts of the community
- Participants should “work together” to resolve
