


# APIPv6TF Meeting AU Economy Update

#### IPv6 in AU — The Stats (@13/2/2013)

Since 1999 there have been 564 Australian IPv6 prefixes allocated. Of those:

- 9 have been returned to APNIC
- 201 are implemented, can be seen on IPv6 looking glasses
- 354 are allocated but not implemented, ie 63% (354) of all allocated Australian IPv6 prefixes have not been implemented (publicly). Of those organisations:
  - 215 are network/hosting/colo/cloud providers
  - 55 are Federal Govt departments
  - 40 are a mixed bag of businesses
  - 17 are financial businesses
  - 13 are education Catholic and few universities
  - 9 are State Government
  - 5 are org.au



#### AU - IPv6 deployment status

- The Australian Government Information Management Office initiative to bring IPv6 to all federal Australian government departments:
  - All Departments reporting on their IPv6 readiness
  - 40% deployed in production networks/gateways
  - 16 complete (end 2012)
  - Remaining 32/110 >50%


