About PPAC

- PPAC in APNIC is a multi stakeholder formal advisory body comprising of:
 - Industry / Community participants
 - Government Representatives
- PPAC's role will be to work with APNIC on matters related to Public Policy Issues for development of internet in the region.
- Discuss public policy issues to foster sustainability, security, stability and development of the Internet;
- Facilitate the exchange of information and best practices.
- Strengthen and enhance the engagement of stakeholders in existing and/or future Internet policy developments

Summary of Discussions

Discussions on Structure, Functioning and Periodicity of PPAC Meetings:

- Forum to have a dialogue on various public policy issues related to internet to be held. Discussions should be driven in a manner on the lines of IGF.
- Importance on inclusion of Government as a stakeholder through an planned outreach programme was highlighted and felt imperative. All Stakeholders need to be part of decision making irrespective of numbers.
- Important to have an inclusive dialogue. Need to assess the impact of technical policies to empower communities.
- There may be a planned effort to bring in stakeholders, including government, but the group should definitely stay open to all members from the community.
- Planned purpose and role of PPAC is to be on informal discussions, sharing of ideas and information. Focus on APNIC's agenda and issues, not necessarily on broader Internet governance.

Summary of Discussions

Discussions on Structure, Functioning and Periodicity of PPAC Meetings:

- Agenda should cover topical and upcoming challenges in the APNIC community.
- Outcome helpful if it helps promote sharing of information and perspectives from all stakeholders, including existing stakeholders and government.
- PPAC / APNIC Secretariat to share policy developments with the stakeholders, for consultation for the benefit of internet in the APNIC region.
- PPAC' focus should be in sync with what APNIC is all about. It should not go beyond the core of what APNIC is about.
- Government needs to be part of the discussion as a key stakeholder. Helpful in understanding each other's perspective for better deliberations and outcomes.

Summary of Discussions

Discussions on Structure, Functioning and Periodicity of PPAC Meetings:

- Decision on forming a small subcommittee who can help work on the draft rules for a structure, functioning, agenda, periodicity at PPAC.
- The sub-committee to comprise of the following members:
 - Dean Pemberton, Principal Consultant, Internet NZ
 - Laina Greene, Pt. Intl Bangun Sejahtera, Tbk.
 - Dr. Govind, CEO, NIXI
 - Amrita Choudhury, CCAOI, India
- A report to be submitted to working group Chairs before APNIC 36 for further deliberations and finalization.

Summary of Discussions

- There is a need to have a outreach programme for a wider engagement of Government as a stakeholder in the deliberation of PPAC.
- The required level of protocol as applicable will need to be maintained.
- Mandate of PPAC needs to include all policy matters relating to internet.
- Sub-Committee to submit its report to Chairs of working group before APNIC 36.
