- prop-113: Modification in the IPv4 eligibility criteria.
 - Implemented.

- **pol-39-02**

- prop-114: Modification in the ASN eligibility criteria
 - Implemented.

- **pol-39-03**

- prop-115: Registration of detailed assignment information in whois DB
 - Abandoned. Withdrawn by the author.



Steps to Implementation

- Proposal submission
- Mailing list discussion before meeting
- Consensus at Policy SIG Meeting
- Consensus at the AMM
- Comment Period to confirm consensus
- EC endorsement
- Editorial Comment period
- Implementation



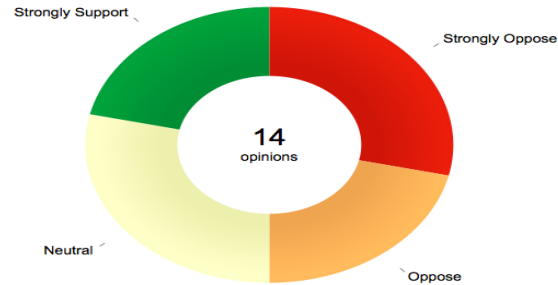
Consensus Decision Making

- Consensus =
 - “general agreement” taking into consideration comments on the mailing list and at the meeting.
- Objections
 - Minor Objections:
 - some problems may occur for some members of the group
 - Major Objections:
 - major problems will occur for parts of the community
- Participants should “work together” to resolve objections



Gauging Consensus

- Remote Participation is very welcome
- Show of hands is a way of “broadly gauging opinion”
 - CONFER is our electronic equivalent
 - The Chair may ask for both

Proposal submissions

Proposal:

- Allow IPv4 delegation to come from the same pool
- If a user applies for a /21 and is approved, the user will receive one /22 from the 103/8 pool, and one /22 from the non-103/8 pool.

Action:

- Secretariat explained purpose of two pools, and
- Secretariat re-drafted proposal

Status:

- No response from author



Proposal submissions

Proposal:

- Every whois contact email address registered should be contacted once a month to make sure it is valid and responsive
- Make time periods to resource termination shorter

Action:

- Asked author to re-draft proposal or submit as problem statement

Status:

- Author withdrew proposal
